


A number of Indian emigrants gained American







The position of proxenos for a city was often hereditary.

In 1862, Governor General Viscount Monck introduced a centralized system for issuing Canadian passports







The First passport regulations was issued in 746 by the Lombard King Ratchis in Italy

He ordered that refugees from the kingdom, spies and suspects checked by border guards and nobody should be admitted without a passport in the Tuscan border, led to important pilgrimage to Rome

Passport was introduced first time in Italy by Napoleon (1796-1815).

After Napoleon was defeated in 1815, the passport was substituted with relocation permits issued by local authorities

It was not until italian unification in 1870, passports became requirement.

Historically British passports were expensive as today!

A passport issued to a Sir John Stepney in 1778 cost six pounds, seven shillings and sixpence, the equivalent of well over \$1000 today



New Zealand became a colony of the British Empire by signing of the Treaty of Waitangi in 1840

Anne Frank born in Germany, lost her citizenship in 1941 became stateless.

She never became a Dutch citizen despite spending most of her life in Netherlands.

Anne Frank died of typhus in 1945 aged 15 at concentration camp just weeks before liberation

#stateless for five years.
Though he was born in the German Kingdom of Württemburg, Einstein renounced his citizenship in order to avoid military service in 1896. Five years later, he would be granted Swiss citizenship.

The Act allowed any free white person of "good character," who has been living in the United States for 2 years or longer to apply for citizenship.

The popularity of Rail travel in the mid-19th century led to an explosion of tourism throughout Europe. This caused complete breakdown

in the European passport/visa system.

By 1914, passport requirements were eliminated practically everywhere in Europe until WWI.

After first few years after Canadian Confederation were formed, too few passports were issued

In 1878, Canada recorded an annual passport revenue of \$50. That is only 50 passports were issued at \$1 each.

Prior to formation of United Arab Emirates in Dec 1971, each Emirati state issued its own travel document by customs office, with a reference to ruling sheikh

It was only after 1971 passports were issued in UAE


